on the newscasts had knowledge of the night of tremors. It was along in mid-morning before the word reach outlying areas, and around nooh before word came from the University of Washington seismograph that there WAS an earthquake of strong signal and it was centered in the Mount Baker-Baker Lake area.

SMALL DAMAGE

As reports come in the damage from the quake consisted mostly of things toppled from walls or shelves. Strongest shocks were in Rockport where Benton's Store had its asiles filled with merchandise spilled from the shelves. Glass bettles were betten in the Glass bottles were broken in the fall in some cases.

Homeowners reported similar Homeowners reported similar minor damage in pictures falling from the walls and items being toppled over. A few cases of cracked ceilings and cracks in masonry were also noted.

At Baker Lake, epicenter of the earth shift, Gilbert Martin of the Upper Baker Dam told friends that the first shock hole his

that the first shock shook his residence severely, but that after that he didn't notice the reported further shocks as being of any

consequence.

In the Skagit valley a strong shock about 3 a. m. seemed to be the last of the series, although some people heard rumblings and felt movements well into the day.

No scientific data has yet ap-peared on what took place in the peared on what took place in the Mt. Baker region. Reports of in-creased internal activity have been publicized recently on both Mt. Baker and Mt. Rainier, with that same activity predicted for other dormant volcanoes from Northern California to Alaska. In the past earthquakes felt in
