#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR 2013 SEASON:

Bake sales in February, March, July and August netted over \$860. Thanks to the generous support from Albert's Red Apple and the Concrete Saturday Market for the venues, and to the Museum volunteers who contribute all the yummy baked goods and staff the tables. Fundraisers are targeted towards a new roof for the Museum.

The annual potluck and party in August is always lots of fun, and we enjoyed music by Dave Chapman and friends again this year at the Concrete Community Center.

Ghost Walks in October are still very popular, and our coordination with the Chamber of Commerce on this monthlong event resulted in \$745 for the Museum from the 2013 walks. We continue to develop new characters and historic information.

We opened the Museum for one of the Saturday event days for Concrete's January Eagle Festival, and were very pleased with the turnout of visitors.

A number of special Museum openings were requested by groups during the year, and our willing volunteers were pleased to host tours Special tours can be arranged through contact with any of our board members.



With funding from a Skagit County 2014 Lodging Tax Grant, we will update and reprint copies of the popular Historic Walking Tour, create a new Museum brochure for tourist outlets (many thanks to Bill Pfeifer for great new photography, see above and on the cover), and purchase an ad in the "North Cascades Travelers Guide for 2014", which distributes thousands of copies to tourist outlets throughout Northwest Washington. We hope these efforts result in increased visitation and overnight stays in the Concrete area.

A new book has been published by Dan Royal about the legendary sisters who ran Concrete's phone system. Copies are available for sale at the Museum this summer.
