

NEW LAND-FILL PIT FOR GARBAGE DUMP



The Concrete Garbage Dump will soon be operating like the various health and pollution agencies want all dumps to operate. This week Lawrence Cunningham and his big cat took over the job of digging a huge ditch around the circle of piled-up garbage on the dumping grounds. When the ditch is ready the garbage will be pushed in, mashed down and buried under a layer of earth. When the first ditch is full and covered another will be dug and the process repeated with all refuse dumped into the hole and covered regularly in a continuous operation that will eliminate burning and create a useable land fill for future use.

Nab Robbery Suspect On Seattle Charge

A suspect in the recent armed robbery of the Log Cabin Tavern, Donald Eugene Peckham, 45, was picked up in Seattle last week by Seattle police on minor charges involving misdemeanors there.

However, according to Skagit County Sheriff John Boynton's office, Peckham will probably be returned to Skagit County after he finishes his Seattle sentence in June to face a felony charge of armed robbery of the Log Cabin Tavern at Concrete. The tavern was held up by two armed men the night of March 1 and some \$150 in merchandise and cash was stolen.

The second man involved in the robbery has not been apprehended.

Karen Johnson, last year's delegate, will report on her experiences, said Mrs. B. G. Gregory, chairman.


