

Over 160 guests visited the museum last summer. Half of them came from outside Skagit County, including one visitor from Bristol, England. Tour groups came from Seattle, Marysville and Sedro-Woolley, as well as a local youth group, and members of the Concrete Chamber of Commerce.

We also had over 150 visitors for the Ghost Walks in October (5 tours of 30 people). Museum members appeared in historic costumes to tell stories of Concrete's past. Gwyneth Akers was a hit as the young lady who drowned in the Baker River.

Bake Sales were held at the Saturday
